

Water Pollution

Cause:Throwing plastic cups into the ocean. Solution: Make restaurants use paper cups.

Air Pollution

Cause: Fuel powered cars create dirty air in cities. Solution: Encourage drivers to use electric vehicles.

Soil Pollution

Cause: Poisonous chemicals from packaging seep into the ground from landfill sites. Solution: Encourage people to reduce, reuse, and recycle packaging.

Noise Pollution

Cause: Planes keep people awake at night near airports. Solution: Do not allow planes to fly after a certain time.
